- Public facing tools including a Neighborhood Map of resources and elder justice related organizations in each state.



DOJ's Office for Victims of Crime operates a National Elder Fraud Hotline staffed by case managers who remain consistent points of contacts for callers and can help file complaints, as well as identify needs and resources.
